The object of the CIO is the advancement of mathematical education in the lifelong learning sector in the United Kingdom. In planning our activities at our trustee meetings we have kept in mind the Charity Commission's guidance on public benefit.

The main purpose of our activities is to represent the views of post-16 mathematics education in the United Kingdom. This is done by belonging to mathematical bodies where our voice can be heard, and by responding directly to government consultations. We have continued as members of the Meeting of Mathematical Subject Associations and have a representative on the Joint Mathematical Council.

This decision is currently under review. The trustees mainly 'meet' using Skype, which has reduced the expenses of face-to-face committee meetings; however, there were two face-to-face meetings this year, in addition to the conference, to enable relationships to be built with the newer committee members.
