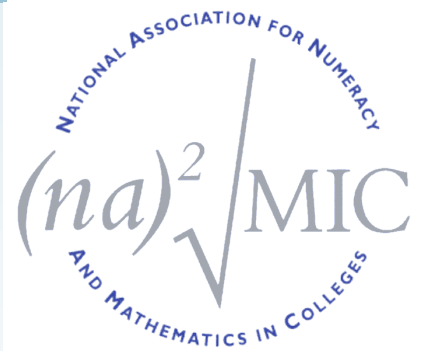

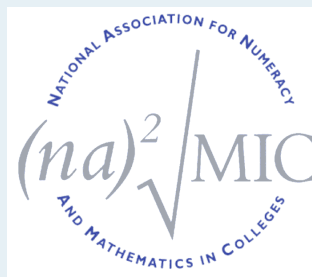

We live in a democracy in which we all have a chance to vote. But does voting mean that the views of the majority are truly represented when it can be shown (mathematically) that all voting systems have flaws? In this talk we use mathematics to look at these flaws and answer associated questions (eg. voting trends and gerrymandering). Saving the whales and curing cancer are two of the great challenges of the present day, and mathematics has a part to play in addressing them. 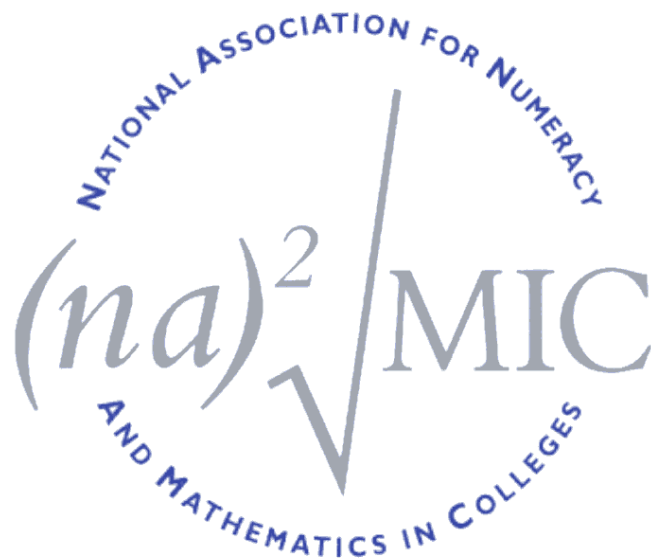
