

What's the future for NANAMIC and its members?



- First recorded 1871
- Association for Improvement of Geometrical Teaching (AIGT)
 - 1897 became Mathematical Association
 - Mainly teachers in boys' public schools
 - Included professional mathematicians
 - Girls' schools from 1912



- Mainly teachers in boys' public schools
- Included professional mathematicians
- Girls' schools from 1912
- Focus on public schools and grammar schools
- 1000 members by 1925



- Primary committee set up in 1940s
- Teaching aids in mathematics committee
- Caleb Gattegno on both committees
- Nothing for primary or for 80% who attended secondary modern schools



- Caleb set up Association for Teaching Aids in Mathematics (ATAM) in 1952
 - To promote use of aids, exploration and discovery
- 1000 members within one year
- Became Association of Teachers of Mathematics in 1962



- Joint local branches
- Both publish
 - Mathematical Gazette (MA 1875 -)
 - Mathematics Teaching (ATM 1955 -)
 - Mathematics in Schools (MA 1971 -)



- 1988 vote of members about rejoining
 - 40% of MA in favour
 - 25% of ATM
- 1994 vote on taking a vote!
 - MA – yes
 - ATM - no



- 1974 National Association of Mathematics Advisors (NAMA)
- Association of Mathematics Education Teachers (AMET)
- 1993 National Association for Numeracy and Mathematics in Colleges (NANAMIC)



NANAMIC

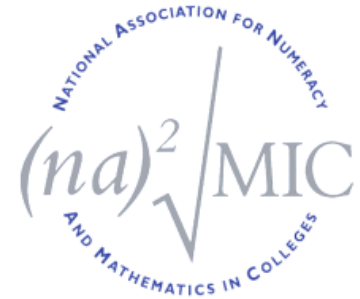
- Set up in 1993
- Members were post-16 colleges
 - FE, tertiary, sixth form
- Early committee members still involved
 - Fiona Allan (1998) - speaker
 - Graham Griffiths (1999) – still trustee
 - David Martin (2002) - speaker



NANAMIC

- Personal membership introduced
 - Trustees still to represent college with principal's approval
 - Sally (2006), Andrew (2007), John (2009)
- Other than colleges involved

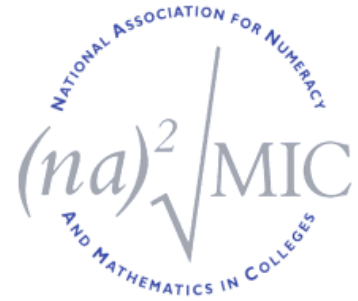


Voice of post-16

- NANAMIC representative on MMSA and JMC ensure voice of post-16 is heard
- Professor Sir Adrian Smith's review of post-16 mathematics launch (July 2017)
- Invited to take part in consultations
 - Pearson next week



- MMSA ensured closer links
- Paper by Jennie Golding of MA 2017
- Subcommittee launched with John as chair
- New charity AMiE set up
- Progress towards joining
- Changes of leadership of MA and ATM



- Project managers appointed
- Save £30k by joining into 'revised' MA or ATM
- Agreed to go down this route by trustees
- Votes started by MA at joint conference (92% in favour)
- Unanimous votes by 3 smaller associations



- ATM proxy voting finished 30 minutes ago
- EGM of ATM to take place on 2 July



Positive vote of ATM

- If 75% of ATM voting members choose to merge – the merger process will begin
- The present trustees of the MA will resign
- The MA will change its name to AMiE
- Interim trustees will be chosen to represent the five associations



Positive vote - NANAMIC

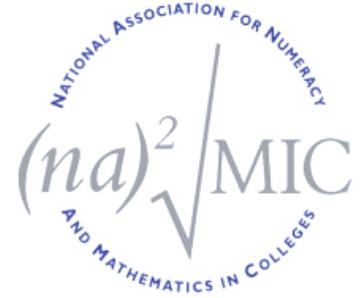
- Over a 12-month period, NANAMIC and the other associations will cease to exist
- Your membership will transfer to AMiE
- New trustees will be appointed
- It is essential that the new trustees include at least one post-16 representative



- May be slightly more expensive
 - Monthly subscription
- Post-16 Special Interest Group
- Will also include:
 - Regular free publication
 - Discounted/free CPD & conferences
 - Discounted MA/ATM publications
 - Access to MA library
